(Point to nose.)

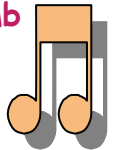
My teeth can bite.

Picture books help your child develop his or her imagination. You can help by asking questions that encourage your child to think about the story and to put their thoughts into words.

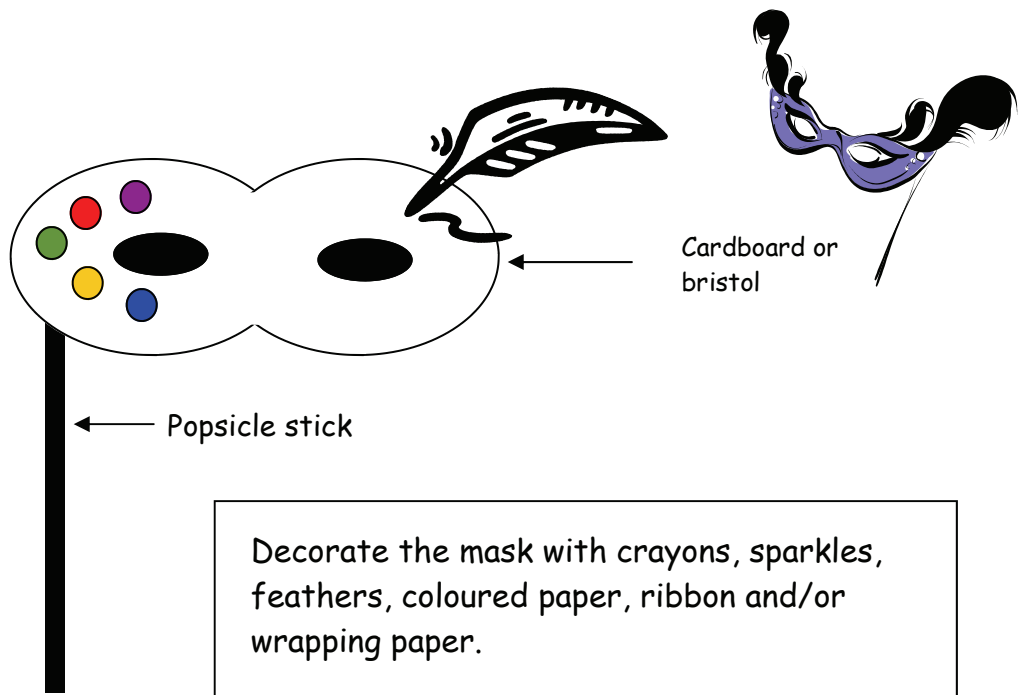
Imagination is essential to understanding what is read.

Masks are great for developing **imaginations**.

Children and parents can make masks together.

A simple mask can be made using light weight cardboard (e.g., cereal boxes) or bristol board and popsicle sticks.

Ask your child to imitate the sounds the animal makes.

Ask your child to imitate how the animal moves.
