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Answer: Both

Reading and writing skills are not learned sequentially. They are learned together.

Scribbling is the first stage of writing.

- Provide many types and sizes of crayons, markers, paint brushes, chalk, etc.
- Provide a variety of writing surfaces too (large and small paper, sidewalk, bathtub for soap crayons etc.).
- Let your child see that you make lists, take messages and leave notes.

The link between reading and writing is made when a child discovers that print has meaning.



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
