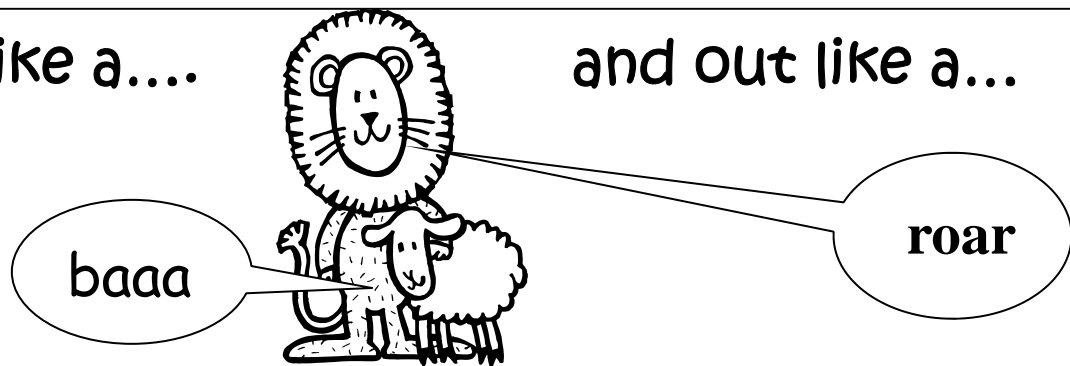


In like a....

throughout the day.

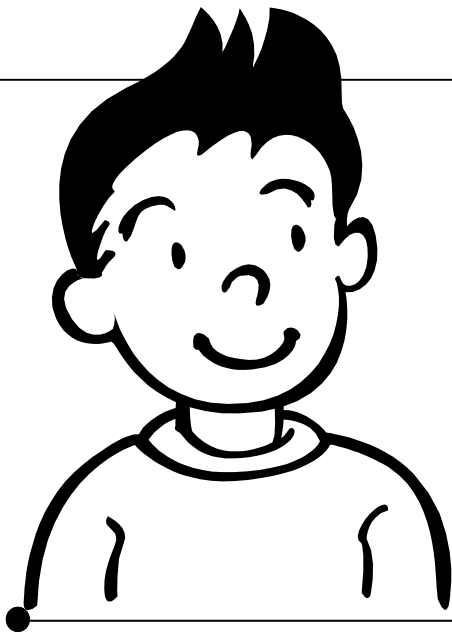
With your child:

- Sit the hats on the puppets' heads as you say "March Winds Blow."

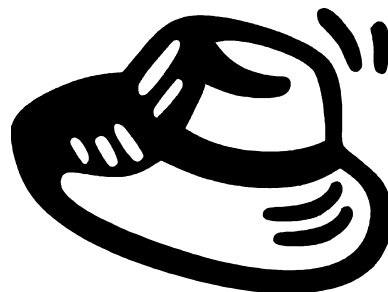
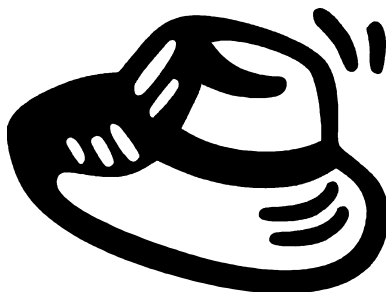
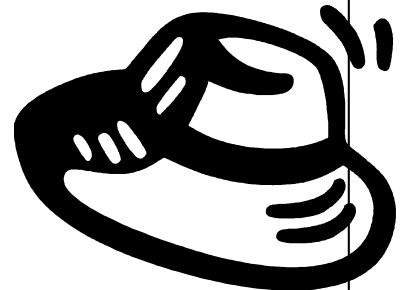
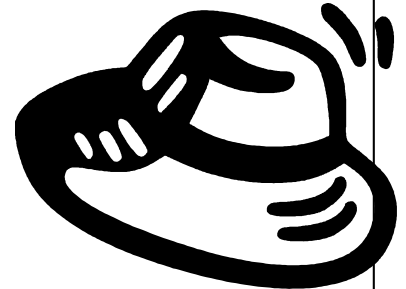
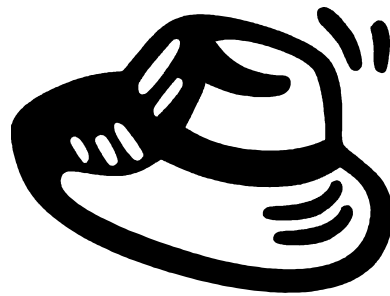
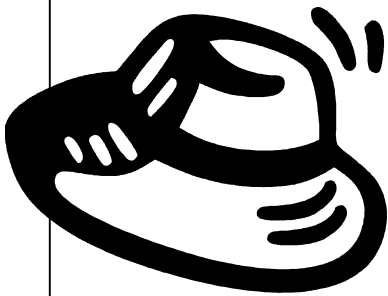
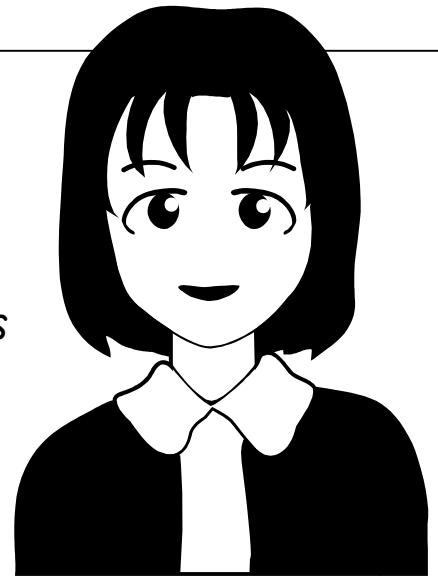
