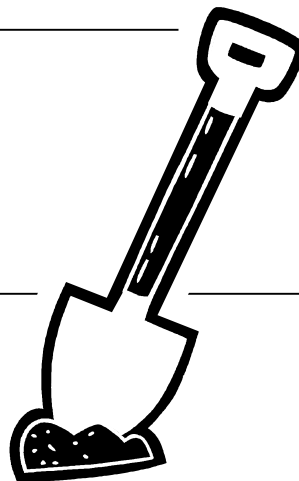


# Dig into Spring

- **The Carrot Seed** by Ruth Krauss

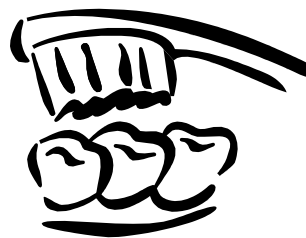


A child who is able to sequence story cards understands that stories have a beginning, middle and end.

Only say one sequential step of the activity at a time. How many clues does your child need to guess the activity?

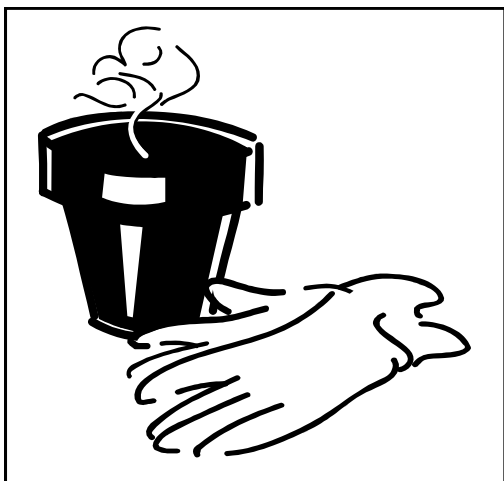
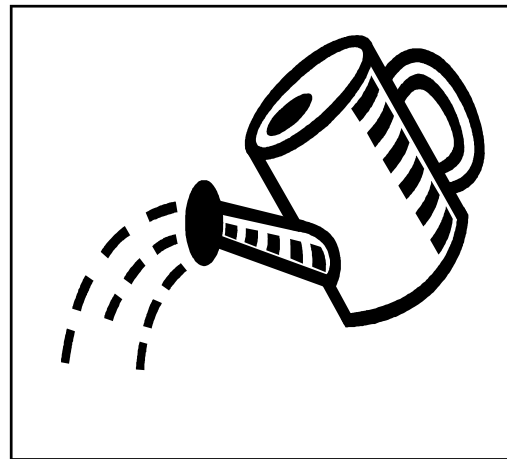
