

# Where is baby?

Help your baby start to recognize himself and learn the names of body parts.

You will need:

- ☐ a mirror



- Hold your baby so that you can both look in the mirror. Point to your baby's mouth and say, “*baby's* mouth.”
- Point to your own mouth and say, “Mummy's (Daddy's) mouth.”
- Point to other parts of your face and name them.
- As your baby gets older, ask “Where's your mouth?” Encourage your baby to point to that part of his face.

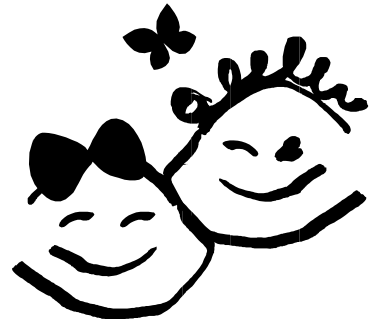

## More Learning Ideas

Look in the mirror with your baby. Make a face (e.g. stick out your tongue, pucker your lips, lift your eyebrows) and encourage your baby to copy you.

Point out and say the names of body parts while you change your baby's diaper.

Look at family photo albums with your baby. Point out the people and name them. Babies love looking at pictures of themselves!
