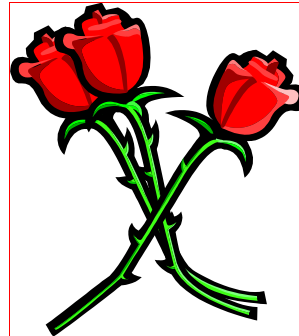

To the tune of "Mary Had a Little Lamb"

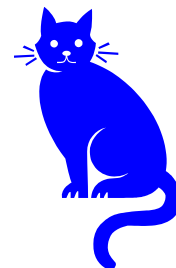
If you are wearing red today,

Where shall I find the little Blue Ben?

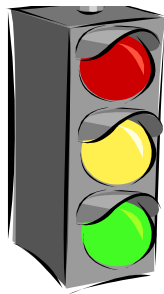


Mary Wore Her **Red** Dress
