Reading Hints for **Brown Bear, Brown Bear, What Do You See?**

- * Go through the book and name all the different animals with your child.
- * Name the colour of each animal.
- * The words in the book have a pattern. As your child becomes familiar with the book, you can both say the words together or while reading you can pause to let your child say the next part (e.g., "I see a..... purple cat.....looking at me.").
- * Look at the last pages. Who do the children see looking at them?

Language Activities for **Brown Bear, Brown Bear, What Do You See?**

These activities are short and they involve thinking and talking.

- * What's the Colour? Play "Point and Name the Colour" with your child. Ask him to name the colour of the objects you point to in the house.
- * Use the pattern of the book to make up your own story using different animals (e.g., "I see a brown squirrel looking at me.").
- * Play "I Spy": Start by saying "I see something blue." Your child guesses until she has guessed the object in the room. Then choose a different object.
- * Ask your child to name as many animals as he can. Write down each animal name. When your child can't think of any more, read the list back, and count the number of animals.
- * Think about what an animal looks like and what it would feel and sound like. Then choose a different animal.
- * Take a walk with your child. Name the different things you see.
- * Cloud Watch: Find a place where you can look at the clouds. Talk about how they look. Does your child see any familiar shapes in the clouds?

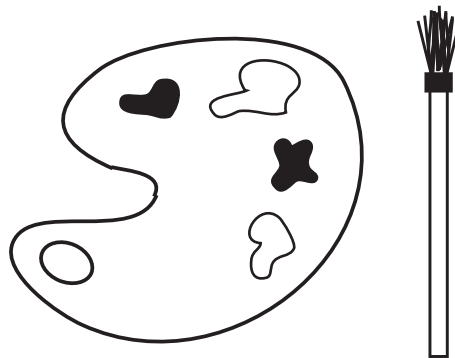
Action Song for **Brown Bear, Brown Bear, What Do You See?**

Craft Activity for **Brown Bear, Brown Bear, What Do You See?**

You have sheets of newsprint, 3 containers with yellow, blue and red powdered paint in them and a paintbrush in your pack.

Mix paints with a small amount of water in separate dishes and have your child paint pictures.



To make some different colours, mix:
yellow and blue to make green,
blue and red to make purple,
yellow and red to make orange.

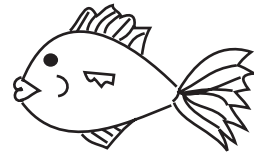

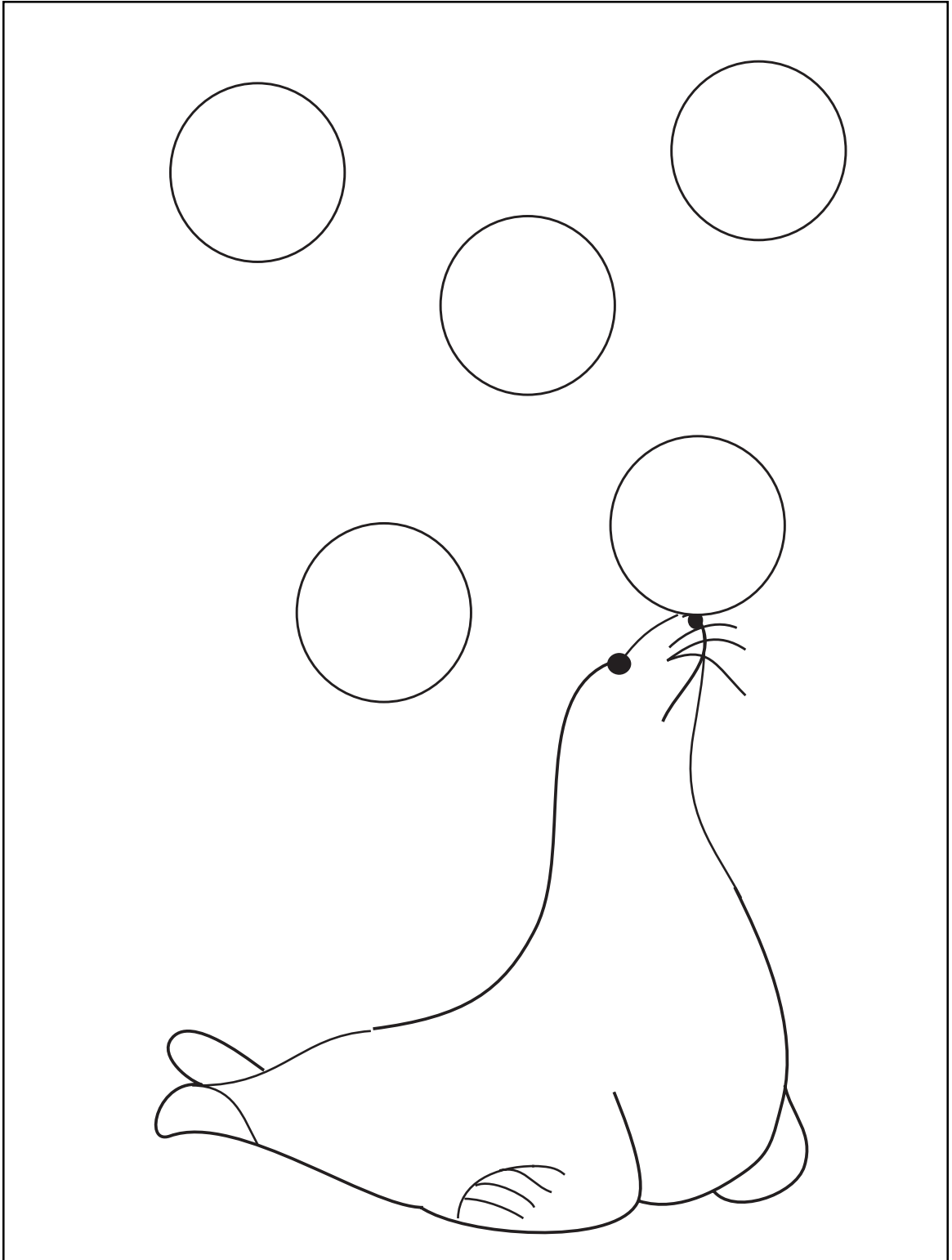

The Juggling Seal

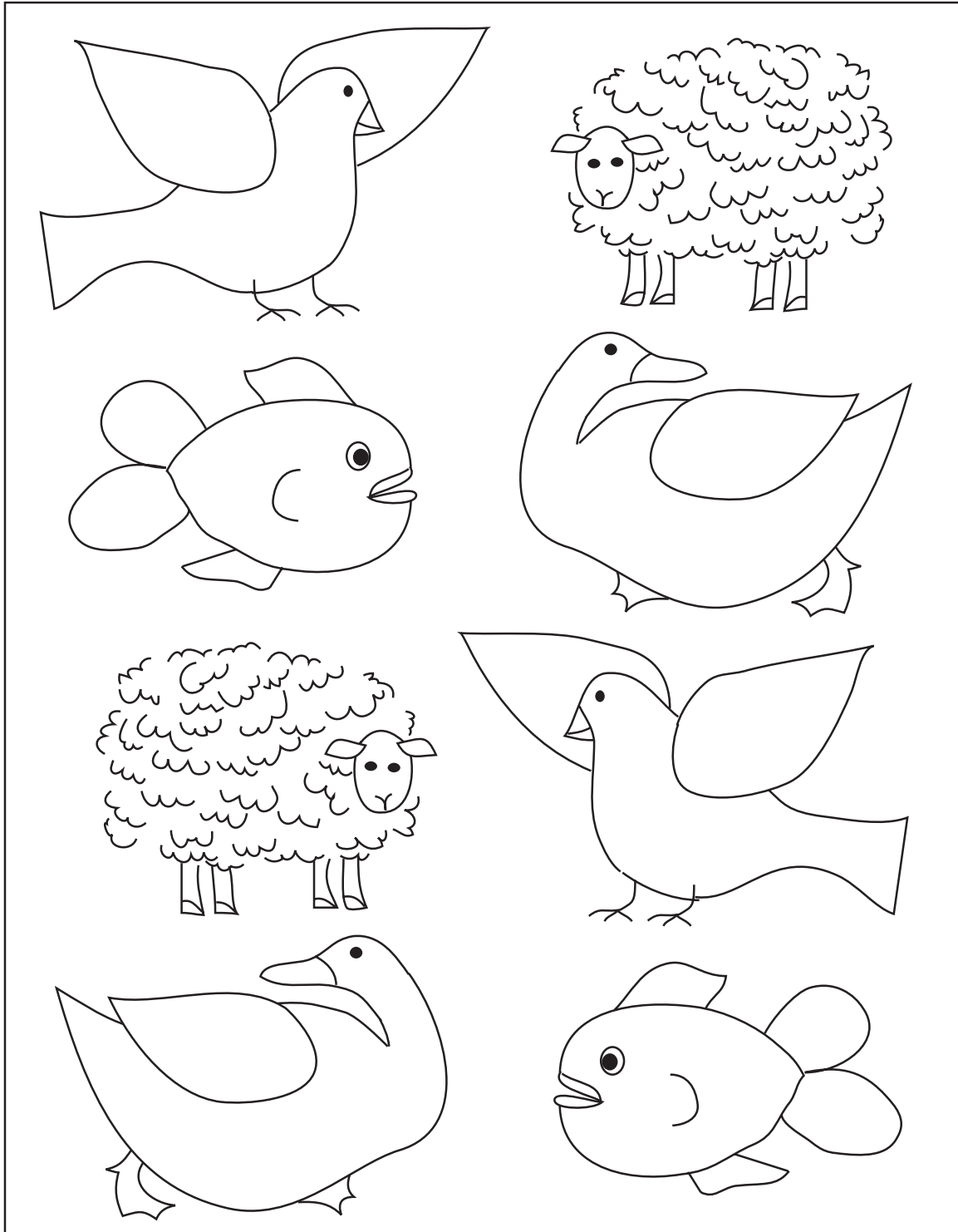
This seal is juggling 5 balls.

Brown Bear, Brown Bear, What Do You See?.

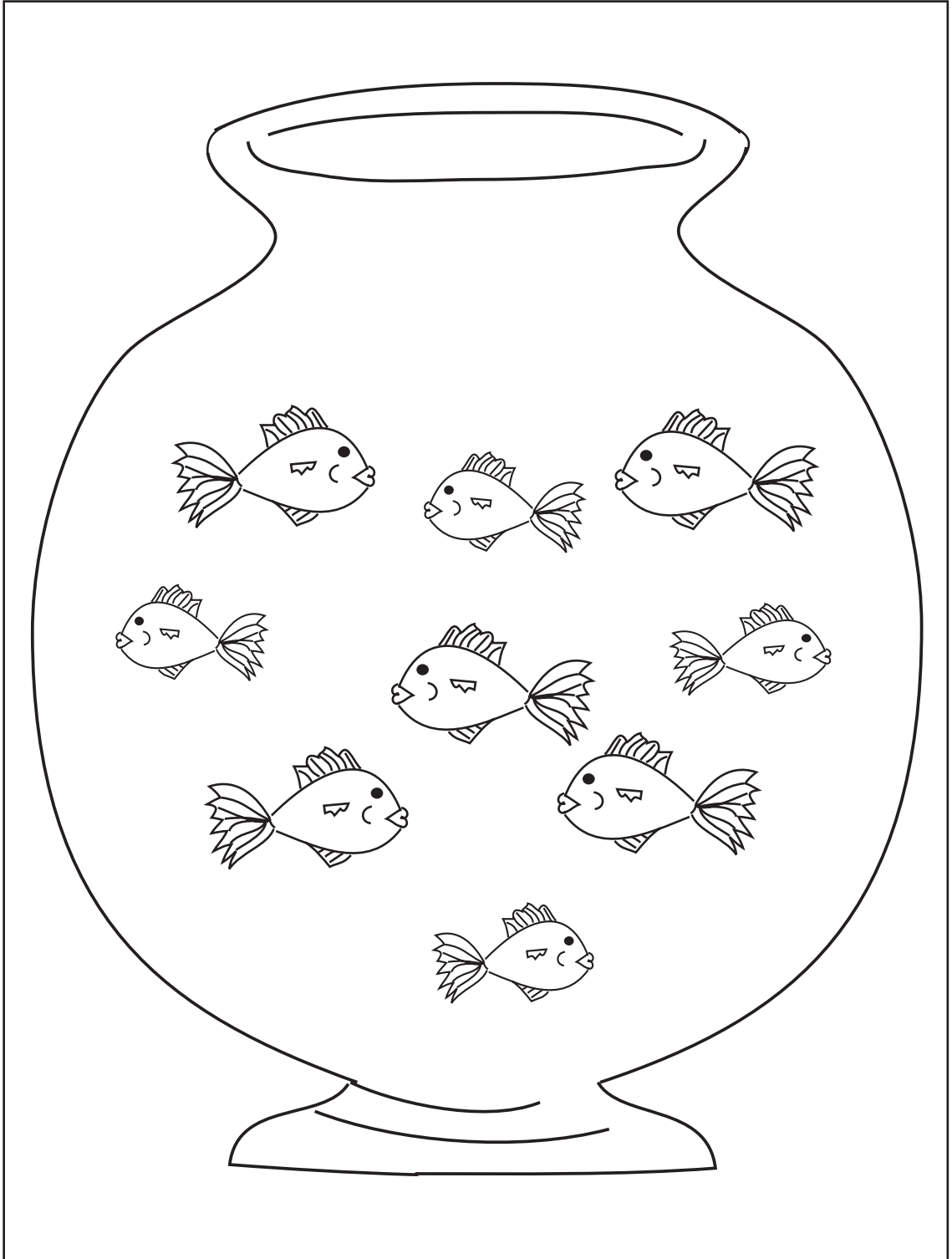


Count those Fish!!

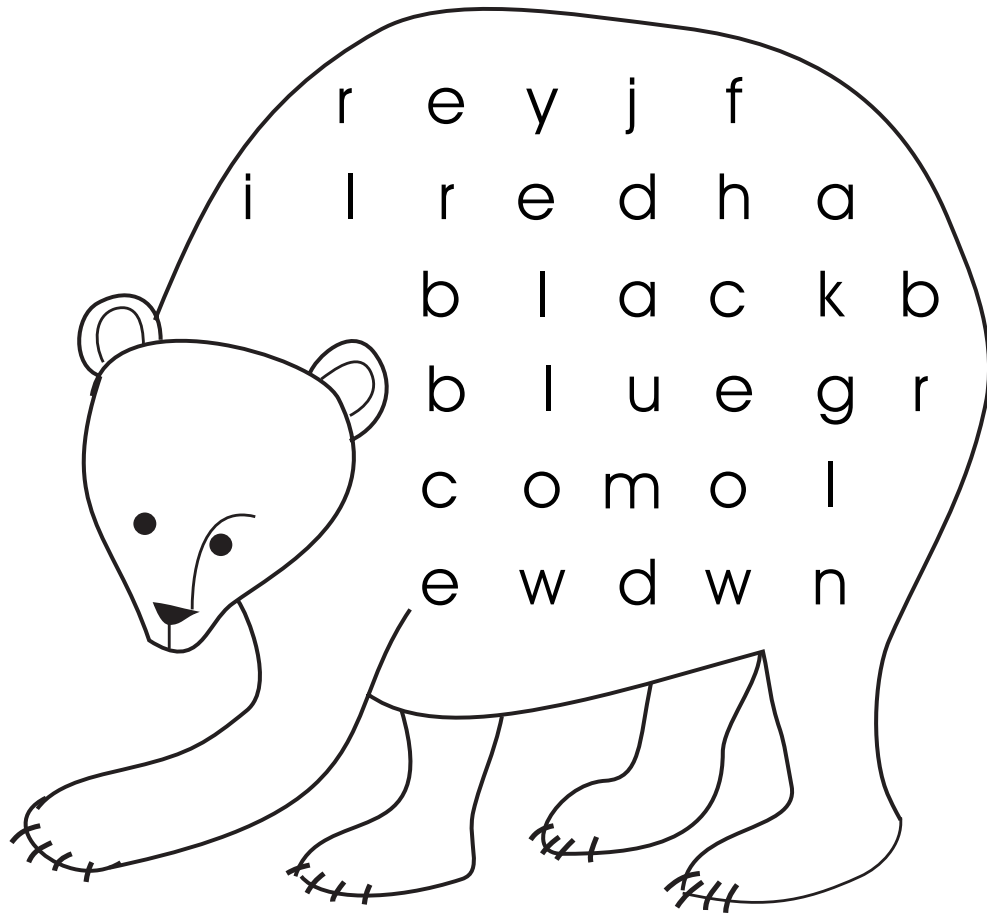

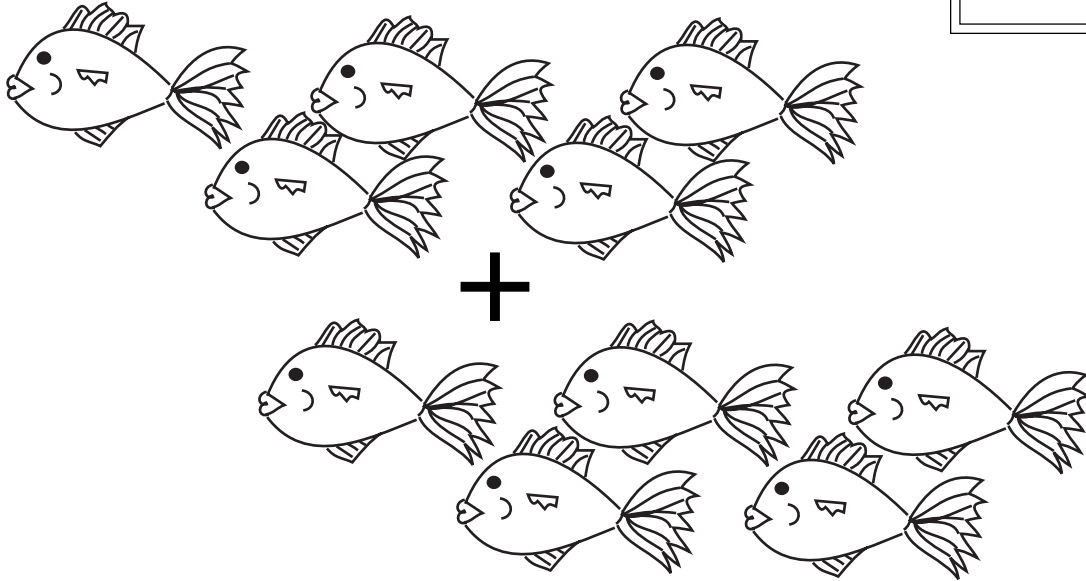

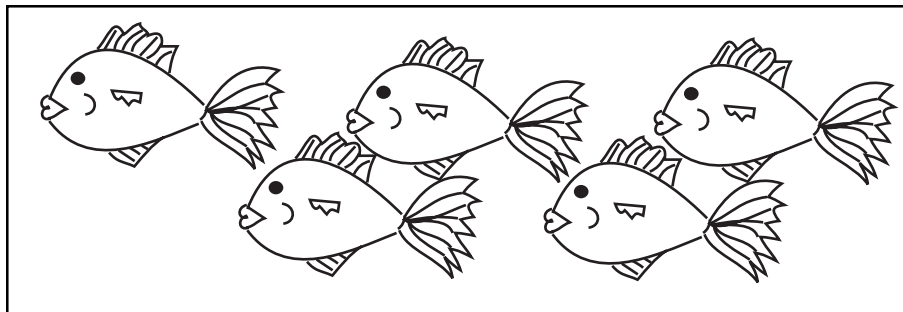
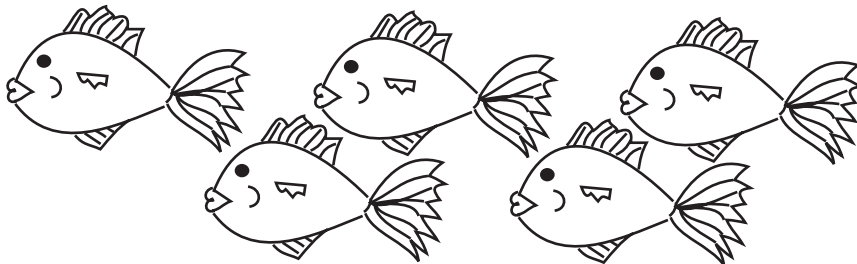
Five Fine Fish
