



**A Job I Would Like**

For some parents of pre-school children, getting a job outside the home may not be possible right now. But before long they will have more time available to work. The questions on the worksheet **A Job I Would Like** gives participants a chance to think about what they would like to work at and what the possibilities are.

(community resources—list to be created by instructors)

Find out what resources and programs are available in your community that would be of interest to your participants. Make a list with addresses and phone numbers and give out copies. Include play groups, parent/child groups, fitness programs, Early Years Centres, libraries, upgrading programs, food banks, etc. Participants may be able to add more information as well. If you think they're needed, have maps on hand to show where these are located. Some participants may be unfamiliar with reading a map so be ready to explain.

**Starting a Playgroup**

If you think your group participants would be interested and willing to organize their own playgroup, share with them the booklet **Starting a Playgroup**. Please note that it is an Australian publication so some of the suggestions and references may not make sense to them. Leave enough time for the group to discuss if and how they will proceed with this idea. Are there any barriers that you could help them problem-solve their way around?

**What Do You Think?**

Hand out the program evaluation **What Do You Think?** and leave the room for a few minutes while it's being filled in.
